

PLEDGING AT THE GLOBAL REFUGEE FORUM

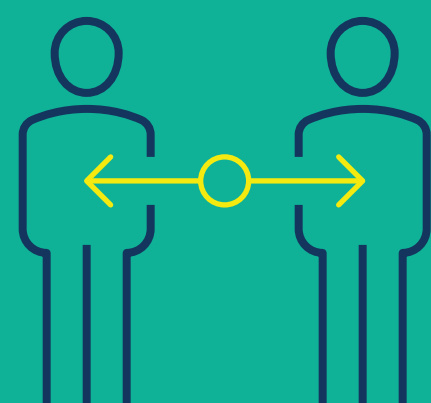
Pledges and contributions are commitments by States and other stakeholders including organizations, development actors, cities, parliamentarians, businesses, academics, and refugees themselves that advance the objectives of the Global Compact on Refugees to achieve tangible benefits for refugees and host communities.



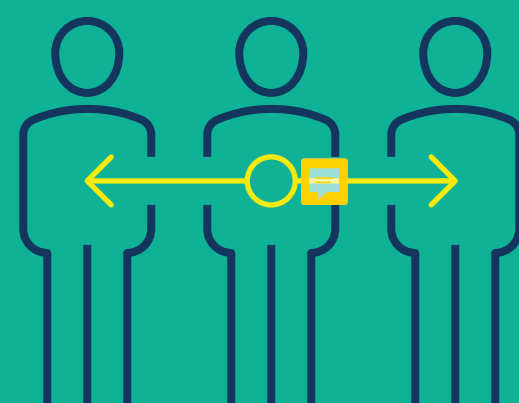
For the Global Refugee Forum, UNHCR is calling for high-quality pledges that are:

- > Aligned with the key recommendations that emerged from the High-Level Officials Meeting in December 2021
- > Additional, quantifiable, and needs-driven
- > Jointly developed, in a whole-of-society spirit
- > Pre-matched to support inclusive policies
- > Developed in consultation with refugees and consider age, gender, and diversity
- > Commits to investing \$100M by 2030 in refugee led and refugee powered companies across the globe
- > Pledge to give access to land for 5,000 refugees, for shelter and livelihoods and as part of a solutions' strategy

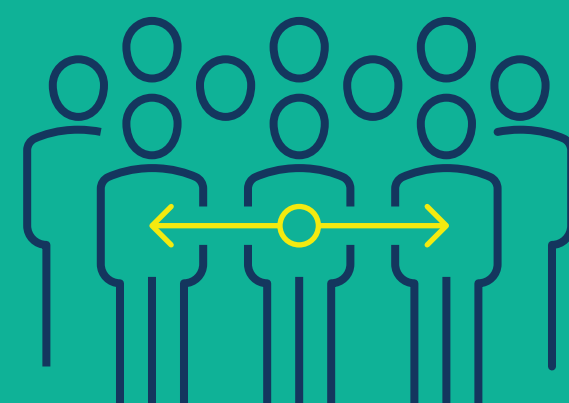
There are three types of pledges:

MULTI-STAKEHOLDER PLEDGE

A MULTI-STAKEHOLDER PLEDGE:

- Is a joint pledge with a large-scale reach, around an ambitious common theme
- Is transformational: it puts in place long-term arrangements that advance burden and responsibility sharing
- Is SMART – specific, measurable, attainable, realistic, timebound
- Has a clearly defined resource base, donorship, or financial instrument linked to its implementation
- Could be multi-year and could involve a combination of financial, material, and policy commitments
