

GRF Pledges Analysis: Meaningful Participation of Forcibly Displaced and Stateless Persons

GRF 2019 to present

This analysis provides an overview of pledges relating to the meaningful participation of forcibly displaced and stateless persons that were made at the 2019 and 2023 Global Refugee Forums based on information available from the GRF Pledges <u>Database</u> as of 12 July 2024.* For the purpose of this overview, pledges relating to meaningful participation are broadly defined as pledges that make explicit reference to supporting the participation of refugees and other forcibly displaced and stateless persons in decision-making processes that affect them.






Primary contribution type


In the context of the Global Refugee Forum (GRF) 2023, **112 new pledges that relate to meaningful participation** were presented by 88 different pledging entities. **80 pledges** were tagged by pledging entities as contributing to the <u>multi-stakeholder pledge</u> on Refugee Participation.










Focus: GRF 2023 Pledges Specifically in Support of <u>Organizations</u> led by Forcibly Displaced and Stateless Persons and <u>National Advisory Mechanisms</u>

UNHCR identified **39 pledges** specifically aimed at **supporting organizations led by forcibly displaced and stateless persons**. For this analysis, "support" includes training and capacity building, partnerships, and funding. These pledges were made by **31 pledging entities** committed to enhancing the meaningful participation of organizations led by forcibly displaced and stateless persons in local, regional, and international fora. The **majority of these pledges specifically target women- and youth-led** displaced and stateless persons organizations.

Submitting entity type



Among the various pledges towards meaningful participation, stakeholders committed to multiple actions aimed at increasing the participation of forcibly displaced and stateless persons in decision-making processes that affect them. Notably, at the GRF 2023, three governments (Brazil, Germany, and Switzerland) committed to create a refugee advisory mechanism at the national level, joining States such as Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and the United States of America, which are already in the process of or have completed the establishment of such mechanisms.

Comparison GRF 2019 and GRF 2023: Meaningful Participation Pledges

As of 12 July 2024, UNHCR identified a total of **180 pledges related to meaningful participation**, including those from 2019 and 2023, regardless of their association with the multi-stakeholder pledge on Refugee Participation. Compared to the first GRF in 2019, the GRF 2023 saw a **65% increase in pledges made** towards meaningful participation. While civil society organizations remain the largest submitting entity type, the GRF 2023 witnessed a significant **increase in meaningful participation pledges made by States**. Additionally, while the majority of meaningful participation pledges made in 2019 were individual pledges, pledging entities submitted **more joint meaningful participation pledges in 2023**.
